On Friday, March 23 2012, at 9:00 am the TAC members will meet in the San Mateo County Park at San Bruno Mountain Main parking area. It is located at the top of the Hill at 555 Guadalupe Blvd, Brisbane, CA. Mike Forbert with West Coast Wildlands, Inc., the HCP Vegetation Management Contractor, will be conducting the tour. Lunch is at noon, and PLEASE bring a bag lunch. The day will end at 3:00 pm.

The following sites will be walked and/or driven by to review past, current and future habitat maintenance efforts. The sites are not numbered by priority.

- 1) Colma Creek : Invasive species of concern are eucalyptus, cape ivy, pampas grass, purple loosestrife, and Himalayan blackberry.
- 3) Dairy Ravine: Invasive species of concern are eucalyptus, Cypress, gorse, Ox-eye daisy, Ivy, Cotoneaster, poison hemlock, and Himalayan blackberry
- 4) Wax Myrtle Ravine & McKesson Properties: Invasive species of concern are eucalyptus, gorse, pampas grass, oxalis, ehrharta, and Himalayan blackberry
- 5) Owl & Buckeye Cyn: SBMW Revegetation Project & invasive species fennel, mustard & W. radish, pampas grass, oxalis, velvet grass, broom(sp) and Italian thistle.
- 6) Preservation Parcel: Invasive species of concern are fennel, mustard & W. radish, pampas grass, oxalis & the Photo Point, bristly ox-tongue and Italian thistle.
- 7) Remainder lands: Invasive species of concern are fennel, F. broom, pampas grass, oxalis, and Italian thistle.
- 8) Upper Tank & Juncus Ravine : Invasive species of concern are fennel, mustard & W. radish, pampas grass, oxalis & the Photo Point, and Italian thistle.
- 9) South Slope: Invasive species of concern are fennel, mustard & W. radish, pampas grass, F. broom, oxalis, and Italian thistle.
