

SAN BRUNO MOUNTAIN HABITAT CONSERVATION PLAN  
TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE FIELD VISIT  
APRIL 10, 2015

AGENDA

On Wednesday, April 10, at 9am the TAC members will meet in the San Mateo County Park at San Bruno Mountain State and County Park's main parking area. The park is located at 555 Guadalupe Blvd, Brisbane, CA. Mike Forbert with West Coast Wildlands, Inc., the HCP Vegetation Management Contractor, will be conducting the tour. Lunch approximately noon and PLEASE bring a bag lunch. The day will end at 3pm.

The following sites will be walked and/or driven to and review past, current and future habitat maintenance efforts with some restoration projects in progress. The sites may not be visited in numerical order.

1. Ridge Trail/Brisbane Acres SBMW & WCW co-operative Coyote brush removal and Revegetation project.
  - a. Brief stops at Brisbane Acres/ Schooly Trail area – do we target these areas in the near term?
2. Wax Myrtle Ravine – Scrub removal and two years of revegetation efforts by WCW & SBMW. Applying what has been learned to new areas such as the McKesson property.
3. Upper and Lower Owl/Buckeye Ridge: SBMW & WCW co-operative Coyote brush removal and Revegetation project.
  - a. Owl-Buckeye Ridge and Transmission Line Ridge - Discuss and view area in light of the 5-year Site Prescription from Creekside Science.
4. Hill W. of Quarry brush removal and restoration.
  - a. Discuss additional plans for coordinated HCP work and McKesson Restoration work to improve the quality and quantity of grassland habitat.

Discussions at each of these sites will focus on lessons learned and strategies moving forward.

Additional topics of discussion will include:

1. Emerging invasive species threats
2. Balancing past work maintenance needs and emerging priorities for vegetation management including:
  - a. More scrub removal
  - b. Potential to expand current vegetation management practices to include other species of concern identified in the HCP. Are we doing enough?
  - c. Fuel management and coordinating fuel reduction zones
  - d. Using fire where appropriate and within the current regulatory framework
